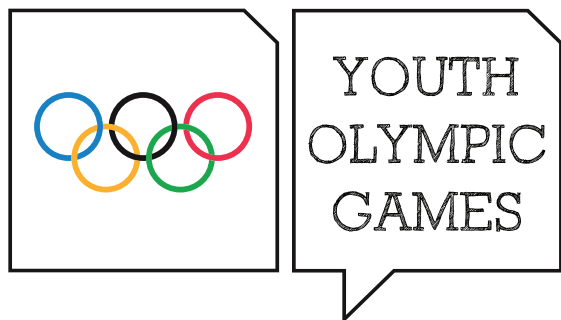

2018/19 IBU season Junior Cup

The top 20 ranked NOCs not yet qualified will be allocated 3 quota places in the respective gender based on the Men and Women List of NOCs at the 2018/19 IBU Junior Cup.

Reallocation Method

Unused quota places will be reallocated to the next best ranked NOC not yet qualified from the List of NOCs based on 2018/19 IBU Junior Cup.

IBSF Youth Ranking List during the 2019/20 season

The allocation of quota places is based on the IBSF Youth Ranking list during the 2019/20 season where athletes receive points from participating and finishing in a total of 4 qualifying events in the 2 qualifying continental series of North America and Europe.

The events for qualification include 7 races on 4 tracks. The 4 best results from these 7 races achieved by athletes will form the IBSF Youth Ranking list. The top NOCs according to the IBSF Youth Ranking list are entitled to 1 quota place each up to the maximum of 18 athletes per gender, including the host country.

Reallocation Method

Unused quota places will be reallocated to the next best ranked NOCs who have not yet qualified a male and/or female athlete based on the IBSF Youth Ranking.

IBSF Youth Ranking List during the 2019/20 season

The allocation of quota places is based on the IBSF Youth Ranking list during the 2019/20 season where athletes receive points from participating and finishing in a total of 4 qualifying events in the 2 qualifying continental series of North America and Europe.

The events for qualification include 7 races on 4 tracks. The 4 best results from these 7 races achieved by athletes will form the IBSF Youth Ranking list. The top NOCs according to the IBSF Youth Ranking list are entitled to 1 quota place up to the maximum of 20 athletes per gender, including the host country.

Reallocation Method

Unused quota places will be reallocated to the next best ranked NOCs not yet qualified a male and/or female athlete based on the IBSF Youth Ranking.

YOG Ranking List

15 Mixed Team quota places (2 to North America, 1 to South America, 3 to Asia, 1 to Oceania, 8 to Europe) will be allocated based on the YOG Ranking List which is created by accumulation of points from the 2018 and 2019 World Junior Curling Championships and World Junior B Curling Championships.

WCF Men's and Women's World Junior Ranking Lists

8 remaining quota places will be allocated by alternating between the WCF Women's and Men's Junior Ranking List.

Reallocation Method

Unused quota places from NOCs that earned their quota over the YOG Ranking list, will be reallocated to the next best-ranked NOC not yet qualified of the same qualifying zone based on YOG Ranking List.

Unused quota places from NOCs that earned their quota over the World Junior Ranking List, will be reallocated to the next best-ranked NOC not yet qualified based on the WCF Men's and Women's World Junior Ranking Lists continuing the alternation sequence.

6-Team Tournament Qualification

2018/19 IIHF Youth Ranking published on 30 April 2019

The top 10 NOCs will qualify 1 team; men or women. The top NOCs in ranking order will receive 1st priority on which gender they choose to represent them in the 6-Team Tournament. As soon as 5 teams per gender is chosen, the following NOCs will not be able to choose the gender of a team anymore.

3-on-3 Tournament Goaltender Qualification

2018/19 IIHF Youth Ranking published on 30 April 2019

The top 1 NOCs (not including the host country) will be allowed to send 1 goaltender.

3-on-3 Tournament Player Qualification

IIHF Skills Challenge Ranking published on 1 November 2019

The best player from each NOC (through their respective National Skills Challenge) will be allocated a quota place. The remaining quota places will be allocated according to the next best ranked players until the maximum quota is reached.

Unused 6-Team Tournament and 3-on-3 Tournament Goaltender quota places will be reallocated to the next best ranked NOC in the 2018/19 IIHF Youth Ranking.

Unused 3-on-3 Tournament Player quota places will be reallocated to the next best ranked player from the IIHF Skills Challenge Ranking always respecting the maximum quota per NOC per gender.

Youth A World Cup during the Youth Olympic Season

Singles

If there are a maximum of 19 NOCs represented in the Youth A World Cup singles event with a minimum of 1 athlete who achieved the minimum FIL standard, then every NOC will be allocated 1 quota place in the respective gender.

Should athletes from more than 19 NOCs achieve the minimum FIL standard, then the top 19 NOCs in the athletes' overall ranking of the Youth A World Cup will be allocated one quota place based on the NOC's best athlete's placement.

If there are less than 19 NOCs in the athletes' overall ranking, then the second best ranked athlete from an NOC already qualified, will earn their NOC an additional 1 quota place in the respective gender until the maximum quota of 19 per gender is filled.

Doubles

If there are a maximum of 14 NOCs represented in the Youth A World Cup doubles event with a minimum of 1 doubles who achieved the minimum FIL standard, then every NOC, will be allocated 1 quota place of two athletes in the respective gender.

Should doubles from more than 14 NOCs achieve the minimum FIL standard, then the top 14 doubles on the doubles' overall ranking in the Youth A World Cup be allocated one quota place based on the NOC's best double's placement.

Reallocation Method

Unused quota will be reallocated in the following order:

- (singles and doubles): to the next best ranked NOC not yet qualified, whose athlete has achieved the minimum standard of FIL based on the overall ranking of the Youth A World Cup.
- (singles): to the second-best athlete from an NOC already qualified.

NOCs represented among the top 3 in the respective event will be allocated 2 quota places. NOCs ranked thereafter may enter 1 quota place until the maximum quota places per event is reached.

2019/20 ISU Junior Grand Prix of Figure Skating Ranking

The top 4 NOCs in singles events and the top 3 NOC in the pairs and ice dance not yet qualified will be allocated 1 quota place in the respective event.

Reallocation Method

Unused quota places will be reallocated to the next best ranked NOC, not yet qualified, in the respective event from the 2019/20 ISU Junior Grand Prix of Figure Skating stand-by list.

2019 ISU World Junior Short Track Speed Skating Championships

The top 4 ranked NOCs in the single distances (500 meters for Ladies, 1000 meters for Men) are entitled to 2 quota places.

The remaining quota places will be allocated to the next best ranked NOCs not yet qualified until the total quota of 32 men and 32 women is filled.

Reallocation Method

Unused quota places will be reallocated to the next best ranked NOCs not yet qualified through the 2019 ISU World Junior Short Track Speed Skating Championships with a maximum of 1 quota place per gender until the maximum number of quotas have been filled.

2019 ISU World Junior Speed Skating Championships

NOCs represented among the top 6 athletes per gender in the final results of single distances (500 and 1500 meters) will be entitled to 1 quota place. Should an NOC be represented more than once among the top 6, an additional quota place up to the maximum of 2 skaters per gender, will be allocated.

2019 ISU World Junior World Cup Competitions

The remaining quota places will be allocated based on the results from 2 designated ISU Junior World Cup Competitions according to the following sequence: 1. First place rank in 500m, 2. First place rank in 1500m, 3. second place rank in 500m, 4. Second place rank in 1500m ...

Reallocation Method

Unused quota places will be reallocated based on the results from 2 designated ISU Junior World Cup Competitions according to the following sequence: 1. next best ranked in 500m, 2. next best ranked in 1500m, 3. next best ranked in 500m....

The top 7 NOCs and the Host Country in the overall Marc Hodler Trophy standings will be allocated 3 men and 3 women quota places.

The next best ranked NOCs in the Marc Hodler Trophy standings will be allocated 2 men and 2 women quotas until the total quota of 60 men and 60 women is filled.

YOG Quota Allocation Lists

The remaining quota places will be allocated, with a maximum of 1 man and/or 1 woman per NOC to the next best ranked, not yet qualified NOCs who have indicated their interest for a quota place, based on the men and women YOG quota allocation lists, until the maximum quota is reached.

Reallocation Method

Unused quota places will be reallocated with a maximum of 1 man or 1 woman per NOC, to an NOC who has indicated interest in obtaining a quota place, based on the YOG quota allocation lists, in consideration of wide international representation throughout all FIS disciplines on the program of the Winter Youth Olympic Games.

The remaining quota places will be allocated, with a maximum of 1 man and/or 1 woman athlete per NOC, to the next best ranked, not yet qualified NOCs who have indicated their interest for a quota place, based on the men and women YOG quota allocation lists, until the maximum quota of 80 men and 80 women is reached.

The remaining quota places will be distributed, with a maximum of 1 athlete per NOC, to the next best ranked NOCs not yet qualified.

Remaining quota places will be allocated, with a maximum of 1 man and 1 woman to the next best ranked NOCs not yet qualified, based on the Overall Cadets Ranking until the total of 24 men and 24 women quota places are filled.
