The Competition Period for Dual Moguls is 24 January to 27 January (including Official Training). The competition will take place at the Jeongseon High1 Ski Resort.

TEAM CAPTAIN MEETING(TCM)

The first Team Captain Meeting (TCM) for Dual Moguls will be held on 13 January at the Jeongseon High 1 Ski Resort. The meeting will take place at the Seminar Room of Mountain Condominium Building B. Detailed daily TCM schedule will be made available in advance of the start of the Games.

SPORT INFORMATION DESK (SID)

The Sport Information Desk (SID) for Dual Moguls and Alpine Skiing will be operated as integrated into the Race Office at the competition venue in Jeongseon High1 Ski Resort (JHO) instead of inside the Youth Olympic Village Jeongseon High 1 (YVH) taking advantage of the proximity between YVH and JHO as following:

Operating period: 16 January to 29 January (operating hours vary according to competition schedules)

Operating location: 1st Floor, Mountain Condominium Building B at JHO.

NOC personnel entitled to access:

- Chefs de Mission, Team Officials, Additional Team Officials, and NOC Assistants

Information provided:

- Updates on official start lists and results; competition and training schedules.
- TCM schedules and communications from IFs and competition management team.
- Weather reports and information, specific venue information or services, etc.

I EVENTS

There will be three (3) Dual Moguls events in total:

Women's Event	Men's Event	Mixed Team Event

I Women and Men Events Competition Format

Each event consists of two phases: groups heats (qualification) and finals. Bib numbers are assigned based upon the FIS Seeding List.

The competition consists of group heats (four panels), semifinals, small final and the big final, divided into heats of up to five competitors.

In the group heats each competitor in the same pool competes against all others in a round robin scheme. Points are awarded in each heat based upon rank as follows: 1st=3pts, 2nd=2pts, DNF=1pt, DNS=0pts.

The best competitor from each panel of group heats will qualify to the semifinals. The winners of the semifinals advance to the big final and the other competitors advance to the small final.

Each heat is scored by seven judges.

I Sport Rules and Procedures for Women and Men Events

Mogul skiing is a judged event and also uses the objective measurement of time. Competitors ski down a steep (26 degree), 200 metre wide course covered in snow bumps or "moguls", and perform two different jumps off air bumps. They are judged on the technical quality of their turns, the performance of the two jumps and are awarded points for time.

Mogul skiing calls for aggressive, fast turns, directly down the fall line of the course, using good absorption and carving technique. Competitors choose their own line down the course and perform two different jumps of their choice on specially constructed jumps known as "air bumps." The jumps add individually and flair to the runs and consist of single or multiple positions, grabs (where the hand grabs the skis), flips and rotations.

| Tie Break Rules for Women and Men Events

Should a tie occur, the competitor with the greater number of votes from the Turns judges shall be ranked higher; if still tied, the competitor with the greater number of Turns judges in favour shall be ranked higher. If still tied, the Turns Tie Break Judge shall determine the result by giving a Turns score.

| Mixed Team Dual Moguls Competition Format

Each team has two members. Each team can have up to one reserve athlete per gender. Reserves have to be defined before the draw meeting and can be activated (if the other team mate is unable to participate) up to 30 minutes before the start of the competition.

The Mixed Team Dual Moguls (DMT) consists of qualification (pre-heats) and finals.

| Sport Rules and Procedures for Mixed Team Dual Moguls Event

The competition consists of a final phase only. Teams will be seeded based on the sum of the team members individual FIS Seeding Ranks. If two or more teams are tied, their seeding will be determined by a random draw. The best 16 seeded teams are directly seeded in the 1/8 finals bracket. If there are less than 16 teams, the teams without opponents do not participate in the 1/8 finals and go directly to the quarterfinals. If there are more than 16 teams, pre-heats will decide who goes to the 1/8 finals.

Teams compete in heats, with the winning team advancing to the next round. In each round, every team takes part in one heat according to the start list as per the knockout ladder.

In a mixed team competition, women shall compete against women and men against men. The lower seeded team must be the first to designate which competitor will compete in the first run of a heat.

The scores from each team will be added together to create a total team score for each heat. Ranks one to four are determined from the results of the big and small finals. All other teams are ranked according to their total team score in each round. The official results will include all the team members and substitutes entered in the competition, and their scores.

| Tie Break Rules for Mixed Team Dual Moguls Event

1. The team with the higher combined Turns score will be ranked higher.
2. If still tied, the team with the higher combined Air scores without Degree of Difficulty will be ranked higher.
3. If still tied, the team with the faster combined times will be ranked higher.
4. If still tied, the team with the single highest Turn score will be ranked higher.
5. If still tied, the team with the single highest Air scores without Degree of Difficulty will be ranked higher.
6. If still tied, the team with the single fastest time will be ranked higher.
7. If still tied, the tie will be broken by teams doing a single Dual Moguls run. A coin toss will decide the gender and course.

I Judging

Each heat for all three events is scored by seven judges. Four judges scoring turns, two judges scoring air and one judge scoring time difference.

I Penalties / Disqualification Rules

Competitors will be marked as Did Not Finish (DNF) if they ski around the control gates lining the course, lose a ski or do not cross the finish line.

Competitors will be marked as Did Not Start (DNS) for no show.

If a competitor is marked as DQB at any point, he is not allowed to continue in the competition and will be listed last of the event unit in which the DQB occurred.

I Protests / Appeals

Protests must be submitted in writing to the jury within 15 minutes of the end of the competition, accompanied by a fee in CHF (according to the rules), which will be refunded if the protest is accepted. The jury, consisting of the Chief of Competition, Technical Delegate and Head Judge, along with one jury advisor, will rule on the protest.

Wax Cabin

Ski equipment is not allowed in the YVH, with the exception of ski boots. There will be a dedicated storage space at JHO where Dual Moguls athletes will store and use their equipment (skis, etc.).

※ Please note that the storage space for Dual Moguls will be located within the Alpine Skiing Wax Cabin and be ensured that there will be enough space for the storage of Dual Moguls sports equipment.

ATHLETES' LOUNGE

The Athletes' Lounge will open daily according to the official training and competition schedules according to the below operational hours.

ACCESS TO SKI LIFTS & GONDOLAS

NOC Team Delegations entered in Dual Moguls events will be allowed to access ski lifts/gondolas at Jeongseon High1 Ski Resort for athletes' training and competition on training/competition slopes by presenting their Winter Youth Olympic Games Accreditation Card (YOAC) when boarding.

SECURITY

SECURITY MANAGEMENT AT COMPETITION VENUES

Certain part of some competition venues will be designated as restricted areas. Such restricted areas as well as their surrounding areas will be patrolled by security staff or relevant organizations. To enter the venue, visitors are requested to present their YOAC or valid admission tickets.

- Safety of the surrounding areas of the venues
 - Police mobile unit will be dispatched to patrol on regular basis and maintain the order.
 - Police stations and fire stations in the region will be ready for emergency dispatches at all times.
- Restricted and prohibited items
 - Please refer to the list of prohibited and restricted items [in the SEC chapter of the CdM Guide \(Annex 1\)](#).

SECURITY AT OTHER EVENTS AND VENUES

The security will be provided for all events and venues of Gangwon 2024.

- The maintenance of public, both inside and outside of the venue, will be monitored to ensure the safety of spectators during the Opening and Closing Ceremonies.

- Relevant organizations, such as the police and fire brigade will conduct regular patrols at the NOC Hotels. A direct communication channel will be established between the NOC Hotels and the Gangwon 2024 SEC Team.
- Fire facilities will be inspected in advance, and fire truck and ambulances will be stationed in the nearest possible location to promptly respond to any emergencies.
